At Barnet both machines and riding clothes will be available.

BARNET GRASS TRACK OPENS.

ON Saturday last the North London Motor Club, which last year was responsible for the organization of the dirttrack meetings at Stamford Bridge, ran the first of a series of grass-track meetings on its new speedway situated some five miles "up" the Barnet bypass road. Both in regard to the shape and size of the track (½-mile oval) and also to the lines on which the events were organized, the new Barnet Grass Speedway almost exactly resembles many dirt tracks, but it is not, of course, intended in any way to compete with them. Admission charges are 1s. 2d. for adults and 6d. for children, and at Saturday's meeting there was an estimated attendance of about 1,300. Quite the outstanding performer was the well-known grass expert, D. J. Pirie (348 Velocette), whose brilliant riding and fast machine took him into first place in every event on the programme—and one which was not. His treatment of the corners—which were as slippery as only bone-dry grass can be—was really excellent. Amongst the other outstanding performers were E. C. Cornwell, J. Blocksidge, G. Burlingham and T. H. Mitchell, all riding Cottons.

Of a series of close finishes the closest was the final of the scratch event, in which Pirie and Burlingham took the final turn abreast, the former squeezing in to win by a length.

The afternoon passed off pleasantly and without any serious damage, either to competitors or their machines. A trick-riding display by Ellen and Dick Cutlack was very much enjoyed.

The only justifiable criticism of the meeting was that two and three-quarter hours was rather long. RESULTS.
