(i) In the Leicester Evening Mail 10<sup>th</sup> October issue under the heading 'Super Speedway to Re-open' it was reported that the Super will re-open next Saturday (15<sup>th</sup>) – the first proposed event of a winter season. Meetings will be confined to Saturday nights only and there may be a competition arranged against a track at Norwich.

Fred Wilkinson and Hal Herbert together with Tom McDonald (Hall Green) were three riders who were definitely going to appear and the newspaper reporter understood that other famous names will later become associated with the track.

The Leicester Evening Mail also understood that a financial arrangement has been reached whereby the riders will receive 50 per cent of the gate receipts.

(ii) Racing therefore returned to Leicester Super as reported above for the first time after the track closed in July. It was reported in the Leicester Evening Mail that the venture was the first of a series of winter meetings. It was observed that the track rode very sluggishly and times were poor. Fred Wilkinson pre-dominated the meeting with some splendid racing and apart from setting up the fastest time of the evening with 75.5 seconds he was the most successful rider in the doubles championship, which he won with Hal Herbert as partner with a total number of 23 points.
